The sale is open to the public Saturday May 5th from 8:00 am – 4:00 pm and Sunday May 6th from 12:00 pm – 3:00 pm. As last year, FOPCON members could pre-order online beginning April 2nd, with pick up of orders on Friday May 4th from 1 pm - 2 pm and 6 pm - 7 pm (pick up only) and during Members' Sale from 2 pm - 6 pm. Annual President's Report

FOPCON has been very busy this year carrying out our mission to promote community interest in the Conservatory, offer educational and recreational programs and support projects that benefit the Conservatory:



- **Uncorked** brought 448 people to the Conservatory. More than half had never been there.
- Educational opportunities abound. KidsFest, the Exploration Station, Toddler Exploration Time (TET) and Discovery Garden Exploration **Time (DGET)** were filled by 3,342 eager children and adults in 2017. Two of the programs – **KidsFest** and **TET** are so popular that preregistration for these is required. Docents led 59 showroom tours for children, adults and diverse learners. We bring the Conservatory to the classroom with Exploration Kits. Eleven kits were distributed to District 97 kindergartens reaching 252 students. We developed a stellar new kit, "Plants Super Powers," designed for the first grades.
- To support projects that benefit the Conservatory, we contributed \$20,000 as the first installment of our 4-year promise of \$60,947 to pay for the necessary replacement of the old heating pipes in the showrooms. We gave \$2911.47 to pay for pumpkins and refreshments at Fall Fest. How fun it is to see small children so eager to select pumpkins from the bins in the Rubinstein Garden.

Our newly created Funding Development Committee and the Event Planning Committee are hard at work. The Plant Sale, Garden Walk and the Auction, "Bid for Buds," were all successful.

In 2017 our devoted volunteers donated 7511 hours or an equivalent of four fulltime employees! The volunteers help in the Ops Room, host Uncorked, sell in the Gift Store, give tours, plus lead the Exploration Station, TET, DGET, and KidsFest.

This is my final President's message. My term ends in June. I'm amazed at all we accomplished during the past four years – the Elsie Jacobsen Discovery Garden, the 30th Anniversary Celebration, TET, DGET and more. It has been an honor to work with such talented people to support the Conservatory, Oak Park's treasure. Many thanks to all of you.

Education Committee Report

The Education Committee has been very busy creating and implementing new programs and activities for children and families visiting the Conservatory.

The Exploration Station Program on Saturdays and Sundays continues to educate and amaze children with new topics each month. The Toddler Exploration Program (TET) has two sessions on the third Friday of each month. Children participating in the TET Program now register online using the Park District's site, and the program is FREE.

The **Exploration Kits** continue to be very popular with District 97 first grade teachers. This year we have created a new kit entitled "Plants Super Powers". We are reorganizing



our kit "Traveling Seeds "to be able to offer it to the preschools in the area. The usage of these kits is a wonderful way to introduce children to the Conservatory.

The **Exploration Backpacks** continue to be a BIG hit with the children. The children enjoy using the backpacks all year around in the Conservatory and the Discovery Garden. We have one set of backpacks for fall and winter and another set for spring and summer. The children's favorite tool in the backpack is the BINOCULARS!

TOURS for children as well as adults continue to be very popular. By the fall of 2018 we will have a new "K-2 Tour", a new "3-5 Tour", and a new "Preschool Tour". In 2019 we will create a new tour for Middle Schoolers and a new tour for High Schoolers /Adults. Our "Diverse Learner Tour" continues to be very popular.

In the Discovery Garden, we have a new Program called **Discovery Garden Exploration Time (DGET).** This program runs every Wednesday and Saturday, June through August (10:30 am - 12:30 pm). We have a different topic every month. A Garden Docent is in the Discovery Garden to lead the activities.

The **Elsie Jacobsen Discovery Garden** continues to be an enchanting place for children to learn about nature and discover how much fun playing with water can be! The children love the PUMP! They also love exploring the garden and the runnel using the "tools" we have for them in the shed.

The Education Committee is hard at work creating new programs and activities for children and families to learn and explore nature at the Conservatory. The Conservatory is like walking through a **terrarium** to learn about nature. **Come and join us!** We are waiting for you!

Volunteering at the Conservatory

Volunteer activities at the Conservatory change from season to season, just like our plant collections. Volunteers are asked to help in a variety of ways throughout the year.



At the **beginning of the year,** when the Oak Park weather just won't seem to warm up, FOPCON volunteers are indoors, transplanting seedlings. These tiny plants will continue to be nurtured for FOPCON's annual plant sale, and some will be planted in the parks as Spring finally takes hold! To ward off cabin fever, volunteers welcome visitors on the first Sunday in March to experience our FREE community event, KidsFest!

Activities continue throughout the **Spring**, as our tour schedule begins to fill in. Trained Docents lead groups through the showrooms, sharing information about the Conservatory plant collections, and ecosystems. Final preparations are underway for the Plant Sale, as the pre-order site is tested, and the catalog is shared with like-minded plant enthusiasts. Gift Shop volunteers assist customers with their Spring Bulb purchases and Arbor Day tree giveaways.

During the warm, **Summer** months, Garden Docents converse and share information with our youngest learners in the Elsie Jacobsen Discovery Garden. Time is also set aside for our adult learners as well. UNCORKED brings guests together on the 4th Friday of each Summer month, to sit back and relax, enjoy great food and music, along with a tour through the

showrooms, all at a leisurely pace. Volunteers are on hand to help make this a pleasant and successful event.

Another summertime offering is the annual Garden Walk! What a great way to enjoy the community, and experience the selected gardens throughout Oak Park and River Forest.

In **September**, students are heading back to school, and that means it's time to get in the groove and learn about new topics at the Exploration Station on Saturdays or Sundays. Our Toddler Exploration Time (TET) program also comes back on the 3rd Friday of each month during the school year. Volunteers run both of these educational programs, creating exciting lessons that include hands-on activities.

As the **days shorten**, the Conservatory prepares for the upcoming holidays and invites guests to partake in an evening Candlelight Walk or peruse the Wintergreens Market. Volunteers help to decorate the Conservatory and lend a hand during the busy holiday season.

All **throughout the year**, volunteers act as Ambassadors, sharing their knowledge of the Oak Park Conservatory, and how to get involved as a member, volunteer or donor.

As our organization looks forward, we continue to recruit volunteers, focusing on specialized roles for a variety of projects.
